Book example:

Pendergrass, C. L. (1998). *Preventing reading difficulties in young children*. National Academy Press.

eBook example

Pendergrass, C. L. (1998). *Preventing reading difficulties in young children.* [eBook] National Academy Press. doi xxxxxxxxx or URL

Website example:

Epsicokhan, J. (2004, February 20). *Confessions of a closet trekkie*. Jammer's Reviews. Retrieved October 12, 2009, from:

If you are unsure follow this general setup example:

Author. (Date of publication). Title of document [Format of document if unusual]. Publishing/Retrieval data.

Notes: Remember to list the author/ editor's last name first and then their initials. If there isn't a DOI for an electronic resource, use the URL from where you retrieved it. For titles, capitalize the first word and italicize. Refer to the *The Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association, 7th ed.* for more information.
